To graduate from Texas State University, students are required to earn a minimum of 36 advanced hours (24 of which must be from Texas State). Prospective students should use caution when transferring in an excessive amount of lower-level coursework as they may be required to take additional classes to meet the advanced hour requirement.

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Repeating Courses: A course taken for transfer credit must be repeated as transfer credit to count as a repeat. When a course is taken more than once from a transfer institution, the second grade (first repeat) and all subsequent grades (repeats) are included in computing the Overall hours attempted, grade points earned and GPA.
